

Descend into the underground silo for a gripping look at the technology that once stood guard over the nation.

Day 10: Tucson, AZ

It's off to **Tombstone**, where the Old West lives on. Explore the **Good Enough Mine** on a narrated underground tour, then climb aboard the Trolley for a trip through 55 historic landmarks—from the O.K. Corral to Boothill. Lunch at the **Crystal Palace Saloon** feels like stepping back in time, and the afternoon offers freedom to explore this fabled town at your own pace.

Day 11: Tucson, AZ to Albuquerque, NM

Today is devoted to the open road. Upon arriving in Albuquerque, you'll have a chance to relax, shop nearby, or simply enjoy a restful evening reflecting on your journey so far.

Day 12: Albuquerque, NM to Denver, CO


Day 13: Denver, CO to Chamberlain, SD

250 Years in the Making

Washington D.C. and Philadelphia

March 15 - 28, 2026



Day 1: Journey Begins to Rockford, IL

Your adventure begins this afternoon in Madison, Wisconsin, where the **Olbrich Botanical Gardens** invite you to step into a world of beauty and tranquility. Sixteen acres unfold with a kaleidoscope of colors, from lush rose gardens to tropical conservatories filled with exotic blooms. The centerpiece, a golden Thai Pavilion shimmering in the sun, sets the perfect tone for the journey ahead.

Day 2: Rockford, IL to Grove City, OH

The road east takes you to one of the most iconic names in American sports—the **Indianapolis Motor Speedway**. On the View From the Top tour, you'll stand on Victory Podium, stroll through Victory Lane, and gaze out from the towering Pagoda, 153 feet above the track. From here the view stretches across the Speedway and the city skyline beyond, a breathtaking panorama that captures the thrill of racing and history alike.

Day 3: Grove City, OH to Gettysburg, PA

This afternoon you arrive at a place etched deeply into America's story: Gettysburg. At the **National Military Park Museum and Visitor Center**, you'll be welcomed into a remarkable collection of Civil War history—artifacts, maps, drawings, even presidential belongings. A stirring film and the sweeping Cyclorama bring the battle to life, immersing you in the gravity of the moments that unfolded here.

Day 4: Gettysburg, PA to Washington, D.C.

Today the battlefield itself becomes your classroom as a guide leads you across the hallowed grounds of **Gettysburg**. You'll walk where Union and Confederate soldiers once fought with ferocity during those fateful days in July 1863. The tour continues at the **Gettysburg National Cemetery**, where President Lincoln gave his immortal address and where more than 3,500 Union soldiers now rest. Monuments throughout the grounds stand in solemn tribute to the sacrifices of both sides.

Day 5: Washington, D.C.

The capital beckons, and with a local guide you will uncover its treasures. The **U.S. Capitol** opens its doors, the **White House** shines as a photo opportunity, and the grandeur of the **Library of Congress** leaves you inspired. Visits to the **Supreme Court**, the **National Archives**, and a drive along historic **Embassy Row** reveal a city where every corner whispers with history and power.

Day 6: Washington, D.C.

This morning begins at **Arlington National Cemetery**, where silence falls as you watch the precision of the **Changing of the Guard at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier**. The day unfolds with stops at the **Tomb of Women in Military Service**, the **Iwo Jima Memorial**, and the reflective walls of the **Vietnam** and **Korean War Memorials**. The **U.S. Navy and Air Force Memorials**, the **WWII Memorial**, and the solemn **9/11 Pentagon Memorial** complete a day that is as humbling as it is unforgettable.

Day 7: Washington, D.C.

At **George Washington's Mount Vernon**, the life of America's first president comes into focus. You'll wander the gardens, step into historic outbuildings, and join a guided tour of the elegant mansion, lovingly expanded over forty-five years into the stately 21-room residence it is today. In the afternoon, the city is yours to explore. Perhaps the wonders of the Smithsonian call to you—the Air and Space Museum, the Museum of Natural History, or countless others—or maybe you'll choose the intrigue of the International Spy Museum. If shopping is more your style, L'Enfant Plaza offers glassy arcades filled with shops and eateries.

Day 8: Washington, D.C.

This morning, step into the **Museum of the Bible**, where more than 40,000 artifacts—including Dead Sea Scroll fragments and rare manuscripts—trace the history of one of the world's most influential texts. Interactive exhibits and a rooftop garden add to the experience. The afternoon turns somber at the **United States Holocaust Memorial Museum**, where three powerful floors of exhibits document life before, during, and after one of history's darkest chapters. Photographs, diaries, and survivor stories provide an emotional encounter you will not soon forget. The day ends with a visit to the **Washington Monument**, where, if you choose, an elevator can take you 500 feet skyward to sweeping views of the nation's capital.

Day 9: Washington, D.C. to Philadelphia, PA

Philadelphia welcomes you with lunch at **McGillan's Olde Ale House**, where the taps have been flowing since 1860, making it the oldest tavern in the city. In the afternoon, art takes center stage at the **Philadelphia Museum of Art**, an encyclopedic collection housed in a building nearly as iconic as the works it protects. History comes alive again at **Eastern State Penitentiary**, once the most famous prison in the world and home to notorious inmates like Al Capone. Its wagon-wheel design and haunting stone walls make it an unforgettable stop.



Day 10: Philadelphia, PA

A “Colonial” guide joins you today to reveal the historic heart of **Philadelphia**. At **Independence National Historical Park**, you’ll see the **Liberty Bell** and step inside **Independence Hall**, where the Declaration of Independence and Constitution were signed. **Christ Church**, built in 1695 and final resting place of Benjamin Franklin, offers another glimpse into the nation’s early days. At the **Museum of the American Revolution**, explore The **Declaration’s Journey**, a special exhibit that brings the document’s story to life. Before the day ends, channel your inner **Rocky** with a climb up the famous museum steps and a photo at the statue—an **iconic Philadelphia moment**.

Day 11: Philadelphia, PA to Lancaster, PA

In the rolling countryside of Lancaster, the Amish way of life unfolds before you. A **guided tour of an Amish farm and house** introduces you to traditional homes, a one-room schoolhouse, and peaceful farmlands, with time to browse the gift shop for handmade treasures. The evening brings a spectacular performance of **Joshua at Sight and Sound Theatre**, where biblical stories are brought to life on a grand stage.

Day 12: Lancaster, PA to Cleveland, OH

On your westward journey, a stop in Pittsburgh offers a feast for the senses at the **Phipps Conservatory and Botanical Gardens**. This steel-and-glass Victorian greenhouse dazzles with brilliant plant displays and themed gardens, a living work of art that delights every visitor.

Day 13: Cleveland, OH to Janesville, WI


Today is a day for rest and reflection as you travel toward home. It is a chance to share stories, relive highlights, and enjoy the companionship of your fellow travelers.



ARKANSAS Echoes of the South April 6 - 13, 2026



Day 1: Journey Begins to Kansas City, MO

Your adventure begins with a glimpse into America's railroad legacy. Day 3: Eureka Springs, AR to Hot Springs, AR

Step back into the smoky glamour of the 1920s, '30s, and '40s at the **Gangster Museum of America**. Here, tales of bootleggers, gamblers, and notorious mobsters intertwine with the story of a once-quiet mountain town turned hotspot of indulgence. Relive stories of Al Capone and his cronies who once strolled Bathhouse Row, lured by the mineral springs and nightlife. As you move through the interactive exhibits and vintage photographs, it's easy to picture Hot Springs as the playground of outlaws and socialites alike. And yes—you can even try your hand in the museum's antique casino.

Day 4: Hot Springs AR to Little Rock, AR

Hot Springs reveals more of its secrets aboard an amphibious **Duck Tour**, rumbling through Bathhouse Row before splashing into Lake Hamilton. The ride blends history and fun as you see both the charming streets and the sparkling waters of the national park. At the **Fordyce Bathhouse Visitor Center**, marvel at the marble floors, stained-glass ceilings, and ornate treatment rooms that once hosted wealthy visitors from around the globe. Take time to stroll the scenic **Grand Promenade**, a peaceful brick walkway shaded by trees, or browse the quaint shops nearby. This evening, history greets you with Southern elegance at **Marlsgate Plantation**. Built as a lavish wedding gift in 1850, the mansion radiates grandeur with its antiques, artwork, and echoes of life on a cotton plantation. After a guided tour through its opulent halls, you'll dine in true Southern style for an unforgettable evening in a bygone era.

Day 5: Little Rock, AR

Today's journey begins at **Little Rock Central High School**, a living monument to the Civil Rights Movement. Walk the grounds where the courageous "Little Rock Nine" made history in 1957, facing down mobs and soldiers to attend classes. Next, explore the **William J. Clinton Presidential Library and Museum**. After lunch at the stylish **42 Bar & Table**, tour exhibits that illuminate President Clinton's life and leadership—from replicas of the Oval Office and Cabinet Room to interactive displays highlighting his global impact. Continue on to the **Old State House Museum**, Arkansas's original capitol, where fiery debates and dramatic events shaped the young state. To end the day, relax at the tranquil **Old Mill**, with its rustic stone wheel and bridges framed by flowering gardens—a scene immortalized in *Gone with the Wind*.

Day 6: Little Rock, AR to Branson, MO

Heading north, pause at the **Arkansas Craft Guild and Gallery**, where regional artisans display pottery, woodwork, and jewelry rich with Ozark tradition. This is the perfect stop to find one-of-a-kind keepsakes crafted with care. By evening, arrive in Branson, the entertainment capital of the Ozarks. Tonight, enjoy dinner and a spectacular show at the **Hughes Brothers Theatre**. Five brothers—joined by their families—light up the stage with powerhouse vocals and dynamic dance numbers spanning gospel, Broadway, country, and rock. The dazzling costumes, choreography, and state-of-the-art lighting create an atmosphere that brims with energy and leaves audiences smiling long after the curtain falls.

Day 7: Branson, MO to Council Bluffs, IA

Before turning homeward, immerse yourself in a true American time capsule at the **Arabia Steamboat Museum**. In 1856, the steamboat Arabia sank in the Missouri River, its precious cargo lost for more than a century. When it was finally uncovered in a Kansas cornfield, it revealed thousands of everyday items—tools, china, boots, spices—perfectly preserved and frozen in time. Today, the museum holds the world's largest collection of pre-Civil War artifacts, offering a remarkable glimpse into the lives of pioneers. It's history you can see, touch, and imagine—making this stop one of the most unforgettable of the journey.

Day 8: Council Bluffs, IA to Home

Your southern sojourn concludes today as you arrive home. Along the way, you've explored railroads and riverboats, bathhouses and chapels, plantations and presidential legacies—each a chapter in the vivid story of America's heartland and South. The memories linger, rich with history, charm, and a touch of Southern grace.

Please note that our Tour Directors and Motor Coach Drivers are responsible for the overall operation and enjoyment of the tour and must attend to the needs of the entire group. As such, they are unable to provide ongoing individual assistance with walking, dining, wheelchairs, scooters, or other personal care needs. Travelers requiring continual assistance must be accompanied by an able companion who can provide support throughout the journey.

Leisure Traveler

You prefer a relaxed pace. You can climb at least one flight of stairs, board a coach, and walk unassisted for up to 60 minutes at an easy pace with breaks. You're comfortable standing for up to an hour during tours of museums or attractions. Most days are shorter, though some may include a mix of longer and shorter activities.

Moderate Traveler

You're a bit more active and enjoy exploring. You can walk 1–2 miles throughout the day with breaks and would enjoy up to two-hour walking tours at a leisurely pace. You can stand for longer periods and manage varied terrain such as cobblestone streets or gentle hills. Climbing two flights of stairs is no problem. Tours at this level may include some longer days with evening activities.

MAKING RESERVATIONS: Contact us toll free at **1-800-669-1309** or **507-532-5536**. You may also contact us via our Facebook page or website. www.facebook.com/swtoursmarshall or www.swtourandtravel.com

DOCUMENTS: It is the traveler's responsibility to read all travel documents and have the necessary identification.

RESERVATION: Reservations made by phone may be held up to three days, pending receipt of your deposit.

DEPOSITS: Deposits for extended motor coach tours are \$200.00 per person, unless stated otherwise.

PAYMENTS: Cash and personal checks are accepted. Credit cards and debit cards are accepted with an added fee.

CANCELLATIONS: You may cancel your motor coach reservation for any reason up to ninety (90) days prior to departure to receive a refund based on monies recoverable by Southwest Tour and Travel, unless otherwise stated.

TRAVEL PROTECTION: Travel protection is offered for all tours and leisure travel. These policies will protect you from financial loss should illness or death prevent you from traveling. Travel protection plans with "Cancel for Any Reason" may be available for an additional cost. Terms and conditions vary by policy. Southwest Tour and Travel can provide this information for your review when booking your trip. *Southwest Tour and Travel cannot be held responsible for the results of any insurance claim filed.*

INCLUSIONS: All items noted in the tour descriptions are included, unless otherwise noted.

TOUR DOCUMENTS: All necessary information will be sent to you approximately 2 to 3-weeks prior to departure. This will include your departure time and place, hotel listing, and luggage tags.

ROOM SHARING ARRANGEMENT: Tour participants not wishing to travel alone may request a traveling companion. Please contact our office for details.

ITINERARY VARIATIONS: Although rare, tour price and itinerary are subject to change without notice due to factors beyond the control of Southwest Tour and Travel.

GRATUITIES: Included in your tour price are tips and gratuities for the **attractions and included meals** that are part of your tour itinerary. Gratuities for your tour director and driver are not included. The suggested gratuity for your tour director is \$3-\$5 per day, and the driver is \$3-\$5 per day. These should be related to the service received and is solely at your discretion. It is important to remember to tip for those activities, meals and breaks not included as part of your tour package.

LUGGAGE: Each person is allowed **one (1)** large suitcase (**40 lb. maximum**) that will, in most cases, be handled for you throughout the tour. We will provide a luggage tag for this piece of luggage.

A small overnight case, backpack, or tote bag may be brought on board the motor coach. You must have your own luggage tag on all bags that are placed in the overhead bins. In addition, if your bag is deemed too large by the Tour Director or Driver for the overhead, it will be placed in the under carriage storage. Bags without wheels are preferred. This bag will always be your responsibility each day, whether stored in overhead bin or undercarriage of motor coach.

DEPARTURE POINTS: **All extended tours originate at designated locations: Marshall, Willmar, Luverne, Worthington, Jackson, Fairmont, Mankato, Sioux Falls, Brookings, and Watertown. Transportation at pickup locations may be done by motor coach or courtesy vehicles. Additional pickup points are scheduled based on the tour routing. Courtesy shuttle transportation will be provided upon request for ten or more people departing from the same location on most motor coach tours. Some exceptions may apply.**

ITEMS PROVIDED ON YOUR TOUR: On all extended tours, passengers will enjoy complimentary bottled water and a selection of snacks, including cookies, chips, candy, and other treats for the journey.

SMOKING/LIQUOR: No smoking, chewing tobacco, or open liquor is allowed on the motor coach with some exceptions. Frequent stops are made to accommodate those wishing to smoke. Southwest Tour and Travel reserves the right to not transport a person or persons if intoxicated, under the influence of drugs, or if their conduct is offensive to other travelers. It will be the responsibility of the passenger denied boarding to arrange and pay for their return home.

PERSONAL IDENTIFICATION: For certain destinations and attractions, a government issued photo ID, Real ID, or a passport will be required. It will be your responsibility to ensure your identification is compatible with the tour requirements. If a passport is required, it must be valid at least six-months past your return date. Identification requirements will be stated on the itinerary.

SEATING ARRANGEMENTS: For the enjoyment of all passengers, there is a daily seat rotation depending on group size and tour duration. All passengers, by booking a tour, agree to accept the policy. This allows everyone to experience the tour from different areas of the motor coach and offers a better opportunity to get to know fellow passengers. **NO EXCEPTIONS.** Passengers suffering from motion sickness are advised to take the necessary precautions.

CLOTHING: We recommend for all of our tours that you wear comfortable shoes made for walking. Bring clothing that can be layered easily for changing weather conditions. Bringing a raincoat that can easily be folded and stored is always a good idea. If special events or activities require more dressy attire, our staff will point this out to you before departure. However, our detailed itineraries are a good guide in letting you know what activities/events you will do each day. We suggest you bring a bathing suit if you enjoy utilizing the hotel pools and jacuzzis.

SCENTS: Please be mindful of sensitivities to strong fragrances and refrain from using any perfume, cologne, or heavy-scented beauty products before and/or during our tours.

PARKING: Free parking is available at Southwest Tour and Travel and at most of our designated pickup locations. Arrangements for parking at our designated pickup locations must be made through our office. If you are boarding the motor coach at another location other than Southwest Tour and Travel, or our designated pickup location, you must make arrangements to park there and obtain permission from that property.

WEATHER & OTHER DELAYS: Additional expenses incurred due to circumstances beyond our control, for motor coach or leisure travel, will not be the responsibility of Southwest Tour and Travel.



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

When should I make a reservation?

We suggest making your reservation as soon as possible to ensure availability and to capture potential discounts. If we don't know you are interested, a tour can be canceled for lack of registrations when there were actually many people waiting to sign up all along!

What is the pace of a tour?

For your convenience, we have assigned **Activity Levels** to each tour. You'll find it noted on each tour brochure. Please reference the Activity Level Guide in our brochure for additional details and an explanation of each level. Please get in touch with our office if you are unsure if the pace will suit you.

Is there a restroom on the motor coach?

Yes, although we plan our tours so that the typical time between restroom stops is generally not longer than two and a half hours.

How much time will I spend on the motor coach?

Each tour day varies depending on the itinerary and the miles involved. Some days you may not be on the motor coach much at all, while the days getting to your destination or getting home may be more significant in duration.

Will I need to carry my own luggage?

We strive to ensure luggage service is available at the hotels we select. However, guests occasionally will have to wheel luggage in and out of a hotel. Guests are allowed a small overnight case, backpack, or tote bag on the motor coach that can be stored in the overhead bin. This will always be your responsibility to carry into the hotel each night.

Are tips included?

Tips are included in the tour package for pre-planned activities and events. Tips for the Tour Director and Motor Coach Driver are not included in the tour price. You are encouraged to express your appreciation for their work and dedication in providing a great travel experience.

What kind of hotels do you generally book?

A quality hotel is vital for the comfort of our guests, with a focus on cleanliness and location. We strive to select the best options available while keeping an eye on price to ensure we give our travelers the best experience for the best price.

Why do single travelers pay more?

If you are traveling by yourself, the costs of hotel accommodations are incurred by one person instead of two. Therefore, single accommodations cost more than double or triple packages.

Can you assist in finding me a roommate?

If you are a single traveler and are interested in finding a roommate for the trip to share travel costs, please let us know this when registering. In that case, we can certainly introduce you to travelers with the same interest.

How many beds are in each room?

Guest rooms feature two queen beds, two double beds, or, in select hotels, one king bed. Triple occupancy generally includes two queen beds; rollaway beds, when available, are offered at an additional charge.

Can I get a handicapped-accessible room?

Hotels have a minimal number of handicapped-accessible rooms. **If you require a handicapped-accessible room, you must request it immediately upon signing up for a tour.** We will make every effort to accommodate your request, but those not made at sign up will be difficult to accommodate.

If it says “Breakfast Included,” what will be served?

Generally, a typical breakfast includes a selection of hot and cold cereals, a selection of bread, fruits, yogurts, coffee, tea, milk, and juice. Most include eggs, meats, and some pastries. Occasionally the hotel will serve a bagged breakfast or a cooked-to-order breakfast.

What will I need for ID for my motor coach trip?

Each brochure will expressly state if you need any special identification, such as a passport. If nothing is said, then your driver's license or government issued ID will be sufficient.

Will photographs of me be used on social media or in brochures?

Throughout the tour, our Tour Director may capture group photos at notable destinations, along with candid moments from activities and special events. These images allow us to share the experience with our Facebook community and highlight where our travelers are and what they're enjoying. Individual travelers are never identified by name in posted photos. If you prefer not to be included, simply let your Tour Director know or choose not to participate in group photos.

What is a “Drury Kickback”?


We often stay at Drury Hotels for our motor coach tours. Most Drury Hotels feature what they refer to as a “Kick-back” in the evening, featuring free beverages and hot/cold food items. Many people find that enough delicious food items are served to be considered their evening meal.

Can I leave a tour to see/do things on my own?

You are welcome to venture off on your own to see things that interest you or do things that you prefer that are not on our itinerary. However, it is your personal responsibility to be sure to meet up with the group at the designated time and place. The motor coach will not wait for you or deviate from their itinerary. If you are left behind because you were late, it is your responsibility to find a way to catch up with the group. Any expenses incurred in doing so are solely yours.


