

Day 1: Journey Begins to Green Bay, WI

Day 2: Green Bay, WI to Ludington, MI

Day 5: St. Ignace, MI to Mackinac Island

This morning, **Shepler's Ferry** sweeps you across sparkling waters to **Mackinac Island**, where horse-drawn carriages replace cars. Your destination is the storied **Grand Hotel**, a timeless icon since 1887. With each guest room uniquely designed and a guest list that has included Hollywood stars and U.S. presidents, the hotel promises an experience that is both elegant and steeped in tradition. As evening falls, indulge in an **included dinner** and a dining experience like no other at the magnificent Grand Hotel—where timeless elegance meets exceptional cuisine.

Day 6: Mackinac Island



Explore original fishing boats, restored gill net tugs, and exhibits that trace the evolution of the industry from prehistoric practices to modern times. This hidden gem not only tells the story of hard work on the Great Lakes but also paints a picture of the families and communities built around it.

Day 8: Schofield, WI to Home

No journey through Wisconsin would be complete without a taste of its most famous export—cheese! Stop at **Burnett Dairy Cady Cheese Store**, where more than 100 varieties await alongside local jams, syrups, wines, and irresistible treats like fresh curds and Olson's hard-scoop ice cream. Savor one last taste of the Midwest before returning home with memories as rich as the landscapes you've explored.
